New Immigration Fees Authorized by the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act"

On July 4, 2025, President Trump signed the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," which imposes new immigration application fees effective immediately. These are in addition to current fees. On July 9, EOIR announced it will begin collecting fees for immigration court filings and appeals. On July 18, USCIS stated that applications for asylum, work permits, TPS, and SIJ filed on or after July 22 must include new fees. Collection of other listed fees is delayed until payment systems are updated. Most fees are non-waivable, non-reducible, and will increase annually with inflation. The chart below summarizes the new fees.
